

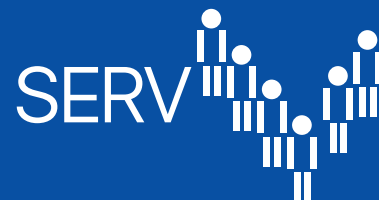
Services & Rights for Victims of Crime.
